

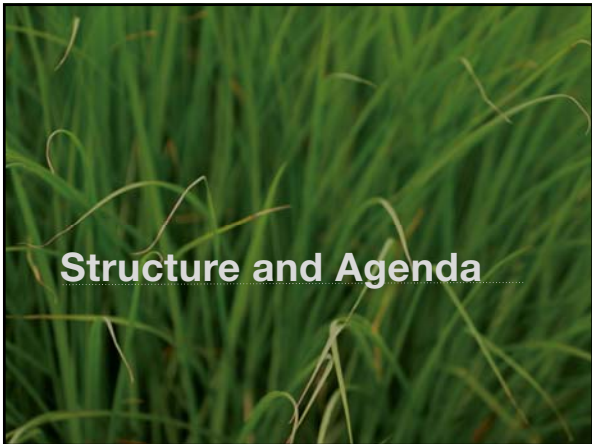

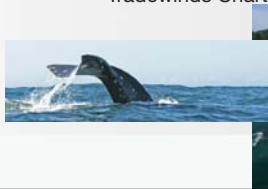

**Reimbursements**
